



JOB ADVERT: Climate Change Resource and Partnerships Coordinator CARE International

CARE Denmark (CDK) is seeking a climate change resource and partnerships coordinator (RPC) for the CARE International Poverty, Environment and Climate Change Network (PECCN). Starting date is October 1st 2013 or as soon as possible with an initial contract period of two years.

PECCN increases the impact of CARE as a global organization by fostering high quality, innovative programming, and, building on this programming, a focus on communications, learning and advocacy that influences wider policy and practice. As a CARE-led “community of practice”, and the first Centre of Expertise within CARE International (CI), PECCN’s global membership includes hundreds of professionals from CARE and partner organisations committed to addressing the challenges of environmental change from the perspective of the world’s poorest and most vulnerable people. The post reports to the PECCN Director and works closely with other CARE network and PECCN core staff as part of a virtual team including: regional climate coordinators, a communications coordinator, an advocacy coordinator, a learning and knowledge management coordinator, and a programme coordinator. Key responsibilities:

- Develop and implement the CARE climate change resource mobilization and partnerships strategy
- Act as CARE focal point on climate change fundraising, resource mobilisation and partnerships
- Supporting and in some cases leading the preparation of high-priority concept notes and proposals.
- Building relations with multi-lateral and bi-lateral organisations and philanthropic foundations
- Mobilise substantial new financial resources for CARE climate change activities
- Support strategic fundraising and new partnerships on operationalizing gender-equitable approaches in CARE’s work across climate change policy, strategy and program activities
- Maintain and improve the quality of CARE’s climate change-related programming through continuous improvement and adaptive management

Profile:

- Minimum qualification of a Master’s degree in a relevant discipline
- Minimum five years of working experience, including:
 - Substantial experience in international development in the context of climate change with a focus on any of the following climate areas: adaptation, finance, smallholder agriculture and food security.
 - Skilled in synthesizing and sharing complex technical information and opportunities with a range of stakeholders in pursuit of resource mobilisation and partnership objectives
 - Substantial experience in strategic resource mobilisation, fundraising partnership development and working collaboratively with multiple stakeholders
 - Knowledge of key institutions and frameworks in support of resource and partnership mobilisation
 - Substantial experience of living and working in developing countries
- Knowledge of working in complex international networks an advantage
- Ability to work remotely but also as part of a global team
- Second languages an advantage

Location

CARE is flexible on home base however this position would benefit from being based in a CARE office and preferably a hub that has a strong climate change programming community with access to a range of strategic partners. Travel will be up to 30% time but recognizing the need to also cut our carbon footprint.
