Climate change is a risk multiplier. The world's poorest and most vulnerable, who are least responsible for causing climate change, continue to bear the brunt of its impacts. This is an extreme global injustice.

The UN climate talks in Paris, COP21, are an opportunity to catalyse action. Governments must demonstrate that they are willing to take serious action on climate change. The new climate deal must be legally binding, ambitious and fair. It must tackle the issue of climate justice and ensure adequate support for poorer countries and communities that are already experiencing the worst impacts of climate change.

CARE demands that governments at UN climate conference, COP21:

1 Drastically cut emissions from fossil fuels and speed up the transition to renewable energy to keep global warming below 1.5°C.

2 Build climate resilience and adaptive capacity of the most vulnerable and marginalised people, and address the loss and damage they are facing.
